2019 FALL BULK WASTE CLEAN-UP NOTICE

Mayor Sherry Capello will continue the Neighborhood Clean-Up Program on September 17-19, 2019, by appointment only.



The Department of Public Works will coordinate the project. The northwest section of the City is scheduled for this year's Neighborhood Clean-Up Project. The area is as follows:

Bound on the North by city line
Bound on the South by Cumberland Street
Bound on the West by city line
Bound on the East by North Seventh Street (west side)

This program affords citizens the opportunity to discard bulk items (items too large to fit in your trash can like household furniture) that may present a sanitation and/or fire hazard.

This will not be a curbside collection. All residents of the northwest section as described above will be responsible to deposit acceptable materials in roll-off containers that will be placed in the City of Lebanon Yard Waste Drop Off Center, 893 North Eighth Street, Lebanon. The facility will be open from **9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on September 17 and 18; and from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on September 19.** Please call the Department of Public Works at 717-228-4490 to schedule an appointment for drop off.

- **Residents must provide proof that they reside within the area designated for cleanup purposes, (i.e., current driver's license).**
- **A maximum of four (4) car tires per resident will be accepted. No oversized tires.**

The following items will **NOT** be accepted. However, we have provided alternative locations that will accept these items:

- No white goods such as refrigerators, dryers, air conditioners, etc.- (GLRA 717-867-5790)
- No electronics – The GLRA has a free electronics drop off center. For more information, contact the GLRA at 717-867-5790
- No pesticides, herbicides and insecticides (Household Hazardous Waste – 1-800-449-7587)
- No paint in liquid form (remove lids and dry out or mix with absorbent such as cat litter or sand) (Household Hazardous Waste – 1-800-449-7587)
- No household garbage, food waste and clothing. Clothing can be donated to Jubilee Ministries, 235 S. 12th Street, Lebanon; Salvation Army Thrift Store, 2211 Cumberland Street, Lebanon; or the Goodwill Store, 798 S. 12th Street. Food waste and household trash should be collected weekly by your trash hauler.
- No items generally placed out for disposal on a weekly basis.
- No recyclable items including cardboard, plastic bottles and jugs #1 and #2 PET, HDPE, newspaper, office paper, magazines, and brown, clear and green glass. Please take all recyclable items to the City Recycling Center located in the vicinity of 14th and Lehman Streets. The Recycling Center is open Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 11 a.m.-5 p.m. and Saturday from 8 a.m.-3 p.m.
- No commercial tires – commercial tires can be taken to the Greater Lebanon Refuse Authority, Bamberger's, Campbell's Service Center, Firestone Tire and Service, H.A. Boyd, and many more.
- No batteries-a variety of battery sizes will be accepted at Battery Warehouse at 125 Schneider Drive, Lebanon.
